# **Sacred Connections**

I just returned home from Temple Beth Sholom's "Israel B'Yachad – Israel Together" tour. The pandemic kept us away for two summers but this year we returned in full force. Cantor Segal, Mark Baranek and I had the pleasure of leading this experience for 56 members of our congregation, including 10 b'nei mitzvah students. It is hard to express in words how this experience is transformative for our families, but I'm going to try.

First, I don't know how it happens, but somehow, magically, the Israel experience takes 56 individuals and moves them from being strangers to being intimately connected forever more. It doesn't matter how old someone is or where they are from or what their religious background is, we bond in meaningful ways when we share profound experiences. One example of this is what took place when we were at Emek HaBacha (the Valley of Tears) in the Golan Heights. As we sat amidst the ruins of Syrian bunkers and tanks, overlooking Israel's Hula Valley, we shared a short service to commemorate the lives of the soldiers lost in this costly battle. As our service concluded, we rose to sing HaTikva. Serendipitously, there was another group of older Israelis touring at the same time as us. When they heard us singing HaTikva, they spontaneously joined in, their voices blending with ours. One thing led to another, and soon we were all dancing and singing with them, led by Cantor Segal who knew exactly which songs would bring them to their feet. We sang and danced the hora together in a magical moment of connection. Building deep relationships is a centerpiece of the Israel experience.

A visit to Israel is not just a vacation, it is a once-in-a-lifetime pilgrimage. We not only feed our bodies with fantastic Israeli breakfasts and taste some of the flavors of Israel's emerging foodie scene, but our Israel experience is also designed to feed the soul. From a welcome circle on a kibbutz in a green field on the shores of the Sea of Galilee to a tearful ceremony on Masada, where our b'nei mitzvah receive their beautiful tallitot from their parents, to a lively shabbat with our partner congregation in Jerusalem, to an elevating b'nei mitzvah service at sunset in Jerusalem, overlooking the Old City, we sanctified each day of our trip together.

This Israel experience is about relationships and spiritual highlights, but it's not all serious and spiritual. It's also about adventure and fun! Who doesn't like splashing their rabbi as they raft through the Jordan River? How memorable is it when a child reaches through centuries of dirt and excavates an over 2000-year-old shard of pottery?! What could be more exciting than riding a camel in the desert or a jeep through war relics? Haven't you always wanted to smear mud on your brother or sister and then float together in the Dead Sea? How refreshing it is to see teenagers put their phones down and experience the moment they are in, instead of curating a social media post! The sights, sounds, smells, and tastes of Israel are so engaging they command our full attention. This is why days, months and years later, we will still smile when we see a photo from our trip or taste a falafel or visit with a friend who shared the moment. The impact of our Israel B'Yachad trip will last a lifetime.

One of my favorite things to show people in Israel is how an Israeli dreidel is different from an American one. In America, we have the letters *Nun*, *Gimmel*, *Hay*, *Shin*, representing the phrase: Nes Gadol Haya Sham: A Great Miracle Happened There (referring to the miracle of the oil). But in Israel, a dreidel has the letters Nun, Gimmel, Hay, Pay, representing the phrase: *Nes Gadol Haya Poe*: A Great Miracle Happened Here! My friends, we are living in a time of miracles – the miracle that Israel is once again a sovereign Jewish homeland after 2000 years of exile. Let's hope and pray that all of us have the opportunity to experience this miracle in our lifetime.

Please consider joining us next summer, June 9 - 19, 2023; our plans are already underway. Or celebrate Israel's 75th birthday with your TBS community and the Greater Miami Jewish Federation this Spring. *L'Shana Ha'ba'ah b'Yerushalayim B'Yachad* - Next Year in Jerusalem, Together!

# **Innovative School**

"I think every parent, every scientist, every early childhood educator who has looked at a young child sees that curiosity, that wonder, and asks themselves, what can we do to keep this alive in a child, to foster it, to fan the flames and not to dampen that curiosity?" (Dr. Andrew Meltzoff)

Dear Families.

Babies are born wired for inquiry and creativity; however, the big question of how to get children to be more creative is often asked in schools. The real question is what is stopping this creative process in children? What happens to these innate dispositions when they are not richly nurtured? Research has shown that children's creativity diminishes in schools with curricula that give little attention, space, and time for this 21st century skill. I am happy to say that here at the Innovative School of Temple Beth Sholom, our team is getting ready for a year of academic excellence, creative expression, social and emotional well-being, and joyful learning for our youngest learners through our fifth graders!

Inquiry, imagination, and creativity will be at the center of our re-designed and re-imagined "Maker" Space. This studio, rich with materials, provides the landscape for possibilities as our learners' natural gifts of imagination, wonder, and creativity are awakened. This mindful time in an aesthetically organized space opens them up to seeing things differently and knowing that they can make unconventional connections which can lead to new discoveries and outcomes. Our learners will have the time, space, and structure to co-create curriculum and explore things that matter to them.

This has an enormous impact on whole child development. Our learners will grow confidence to take intentional risks in their learning process, helping to scaffold their understandings as they see that there are many ways of doing things and often many right answers. During these learning experiences, we encourage our learners to share their wildest insights and colorful metaphors in this process. This is the best direction to take to prepare our children for the 21st century and future in a world where creativity is needed. This is a "pulling out" model of their imagination, wonder and creativity model directly opposite to a "push in" approach, which stifles these innate skills. Rote learning (memorization) must be replaced with the ability to creatively problem solve and discover!

To quote Thomas Armstrong, renowned educator, psychologist, and writer, "With creativity it's the process

that's much more important than the end product -the iourney is far more important than the destination. especially in the child's early years." Armstrong acknowledges that often teachers experience pressure from parents (and well-intentioned administrators) to meet certain guidelines. He believes if this is the case, a balance needs to be struck where a teacher can use a portion of the day to focus on specific objectives that are deemed necessary to "teach." At least an equal amount of each day can be devoted to an open-ended approach with no specific objectives in mind. These two philosophies can work together since children who have more access to their own creative reserves are not only better able to function in the world but are better equipped to meet the learning objectives set forth by the curriculum. Armstrong goes on to say that "The more complicated the world gets, the more we need that inner playful spirit, that curiosity. that ability to see new connections. These are the things that help us, and our children adapt to the changes we'll experience all our lives."

I invite you to schedule time to visit our enchanted school and see joyful learning at its best!

#### **#OnwardHebrew - How is it Going?**

I know there was great trepidation when we adopted an innovative approach to Hebrew learning four years ago. Ours was not going to be the Hebrew school that many of us knew from our own years growing up. From what I could tell following a visioning session with members of the religious school committee, this was exactly the point. Our TBS kids were not engaged with Jewish learning, and for the most part, they detested every minute of their experience – especially Hebrew.

So, we shifted course and joined a growing movement of religious schools across North America who were trying something new. The realities of our world necessitated that we do something other than what we have always done. For decades, children attended Hebrew school two or three times per week, and our method of teaching Hebrew worked within that model. Now, our children have many more activities and commitments outside of their full-time schools, and families have decided not to prioritize multiple days of Hebrew school within these schedules. With significantly fewer hours of contact time, we could not keep teaching Hebrew in the same way. And when learning Hebrew was the least preferred activity for most of our children, the impetus by parents to push even minimal attendance dwindled.

The #OnwardHebrew movement turned Hebrew learning on its head. Rather than spend years sitting in classrooms and listening to peers read the same lines from a book over and over again, we now utilize the Sound-to-Print methodology of language learning. This mimics natural language acquisition and is exactly what it says. Children learn how the language sounds and have several years of familiarity with that before they begin to read. This method solidifies the sounds of the language in their heads – and their ears – so that when presented with a symbol/letter, they already have a blueprint against which to match it with something.

What have we learned in the past four years? To start, our learners are entirely engaged with the Hebrew language! They look forward to Hebrew Through Movement on Saturday mornings in jLAB, and they take considerable pride in all the vocabulary they learn. One of the most significant observations we encounter each year is the incredible level of retention our learners exhibit after a summer away. This was unheard of in our previous model, and we spent the first couple of months of each school year reviewing

before being able to move forward. Our new learners catch on very quickly; the social nature of the curriculum allows for children to model for one another, and in no way is this considered cheating. In fact, it is encouraged! Additionally, the kinesthetic learning truly "gets into their bones," which is likely a primary factor related to these prominent levels of retention. When our children get to experience the language, it stays with them far more than simply being exposed to it.

Our Hebrew-rich *Tefilah* further allows our learners to experience the language within a natural setting. Their aural familiarity with the prayers helps them to decode faster once they are introduced to the written prayers in 4th grade. Sight-reading these known words is a great boost for them to dig into the world of Hebrew reading by 5th grade.

During this past school year, I was visiting a 6th grade class who was reading the *V'ahavta* prayer. The teacher asked the learners, "Do you remember how to say, "to sit" from Hebrew Through Movement?" They answered, "Yes, *lashevet*." The teacher then pointed out the phrase *b'shivtecha b'veitecha* – when you sit in your house. It was almost as if I could actually see the proverbial lightbulb over the learners' heads during this "a-ha" moment – they were so excited to make the connection between a seemingly innocuous word and this well-known prayer!

Does this lead to our learners reading quickly? In most cases, the answer is no. With such limited time, it is nearly impossible for our learners to truly read Hebrew in the manner that they read English. However, their decoding skills are excellent; after so many years of exposure to hearing the language, they are able to sound out what they read with confidence. Perhaps more importantly, they have developed an enjoyment around learning Hebrew that provides a positive association for our learners between the language of our people and their greater Jewish selves. This will likely keep them learning and engaged for many years ahead.

We gratefully acknowledge the Greater Miami Jewish Federation for providing us with funds from the Synagogue Supplemental School Scholarship Program, allowing us to provide a Jewish education for every child in our congregation.



#### Message from our Sister Congregation in Israel

## How beautiful and pleasant it is to dwell together as brothers and sisters.

We were very fortunate this summer to greet the participants of the TBS congregational trip at our Synagogue for Kabbalat Shabbat. It was inspirational for us to have you here. We prayed with devotion and the spirit of this exceptional Shabbat helped all of us "reach the heights." It was especially meaningful to me in light of my earlier visit to your congregation.

It was so wonderful to see Rabbi Pomerantz, Mark Baranek and Cantor Lisa along with the delightful group and the B'nei Mitzvah kids were exceptional! Thank you very much for adding us to your trip. May we have many more opportunities to pray together!

The Israeli "Government of Change and Renewal" fell from power. The opposition pushed through a Vote of No Confidence and we now have a caretaker government until the new elections in early November. These will be the fifth elections in two years, which is well beyond the ridiculous... Yair Lapid replaced Naftali Bennet as Prime Minister—in line with their agreement, which many cynics predicted would not be honored. Exploiting the nature of the Israeli electoral system, eight small parties from different points in the political and ideological spectrum were able to combine to banish Netanyahu's Likud party and its right-wing and ultra-Orthodox allies from power. Moderate Right and Left together, a coalition of parties with substantial differences raised hopes that Israel could adopt a more moderate and conciliatory political culture. The parliamentary opposition, led by Binyamin Netanyahu—who had been Prime Minister for close to fifteen years—was ultimately successful in its efforts to prove this vision currently unrealistic.

Israeli society is divided and frankly this is not all that different from what's going on in the U.S. With all our problems, thank God that we are not dealing with a similar problem of gun control...

Gilad Kariv, former CEO of the Israel Movement for Progressive Judaism, was elected to the Knesset (the Israeli parliament) on behalf of the Israeli Labor Party and has become a highly respected parliamentarian, serving as Chairman of the Law Committee. This was the first time that Reform—and Liberal Judaism in general—had an authentic representative in the Knesset. Rabbi Gilad has represented us honorably over the years in the struggle for the rights of Liberal Jews, as well as the need to transform the State of Israel into a more tolerant society, where all kinds of Jews can feel welcome.

One of the major issues at hand is the division of the Western Wall—a division that we insist should include an egalitarian section alongside the separate areas for men and women. We also seek legal recognition of Reform conversions and more. The Ultra-Orthodox parties have had a very hard time with the representation of Liberal Judaism in the Knesset, boycotting Gilad's appearances in a very infantile manner. This, of course, contributed to his image as an even more popular and inspirational figure. We need him to continue to represent us and are working hard to keep him in office after the coming elections.

Summer is a wonderful time of the year and it is extremely wonderful that tourism has come back. We are waiting to greet all of you who find yourselves in the country at Kehillat Hadror.


